

The Cross

The Sunday of the Veneration of the Precious Cross is the third Sunday of Great Lent. On this day, the cross is brought to the middle of the church. Orthodox Christians prostrate before it, singing: *Before Thy Cross, we bow down in worship, O Master, and Thy holy Resurrection we glorify*.

The Veneration of the Cross is celebrated in the middle of Great Lent to remind us of what we are striving for through our prayer and fasting. The cross lets us remember that as hard as Great Lent seems, it is worth it in the end, at the gladness and rejoicing of Blessed and Holy Pascha!

Before Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection, the cross was used to punish criminals and was seen as an awful thing. However, by dying on the cross for us and for our salvation, Christ has made the cross a symbol of the Holy Orthodox Church and has turned it into a guardian of Christians against demons.

We the Orthodox wear crosses around our necks in order to protect us. Rejoice in the All-holy, venerable and life-bearing Cross!
