The Fathers of the First Six Ecumenical Councils

The Orthodox Church remembers Six Holy Ecumenical Councils today:

The First Ecumenical Council is remembered May 29, and also on seventh Sunday after Pascha. It was formed in the year 325 under St. Constantine the Great.

The Second Council is remembered May 22 and was made in the year 381 by the emperor Theodosius the Great.

The Third Council, celebrated on September 9, was created in the year 431 by the emperor Theodosius the Younger.

The Fourth Council, celebrated July 16, was founded in the year 451 under the emperor Marcian.

The Fifth Council, which is commemorated July 25, was formed in the year 553, under the emperor Justinian the Great.

The Sixth Ecumenical Council, on January 23, met during the years 680-681 under the emperor Constantine Pogonatos.

The feast of The Fathers of the First Six (out of seven) Ecumenical Councils is held on any Sunday between July 13 and July 19. This year it is on Sunday the 14. The first six councils have established one faith for the Church, meaning they set up the Orthodox Faith, based on the preaching of the Apostles. Thank God for holy Orthodox people strong enough to stand up for the Church!
